What hygiene rooms are like

A hygiene room is a toilet that is bigger than other toilets, and has extra things in it to help you.

At a school for younger children, the hygiene room might have:






A hoist to lift you safely.



Space for you and your helper.

At a school for older children, the hygiene room might also have:





A shower.



A different type of toilet called a sluice toilet.

Every hygiene room is designed to suit the people who use it.



How they are made

When your school plans a hygiene room, they work with:



An Occupational Therapist to make sure the design works for you.



A company like Astor Bannerman to help choose and install the right equipment.

Space to move around





Privacy and safety



Calm, comfortable colours

A Hygiene Room might include:



Changing tables that move up and down



Ceiling hoists to help lift safely



Washbasins you can reach easily



Showers with no step so they are easier to get into



Privacy screens so you feel comfortable

Training and safety

School staff are trained to use the equipment safely.

They learn how to help you feel comfortable and how to keep the room clean and safe for everyone.

Equipment is checked often to make sure it works properly.
